THE FUTURE OF VLOA AND REUNIONS

Or

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

By 2010 we will approaching our SIXTH biennial reunion. 1) Branson 2) San Antonio 3) Ft. Rucker 4) Pigeon Forge 5) Hershey 6) 2010.

The focus of the concept for reunions and VLOA has been on any of those who were assigned or attached to the Outlaws from 8/64 to 9/65. At the inception of the VLOA concept a roster was compiled of 500+ names of those known who served anytime during that period (Master Roster), of which some 250 were located and contacted (Confirmed Roster). The confirmed roster has been the basis for newsletter mail outs, and the well from which VLOA membership has sprung. VLOA membership now totals 74 (lifetime, annual, associate and honorary) approximately 29.6% of the confirmed roster. Admittedly, VLOA efforts to continue the search for others remaining on the master roster, not already located and contacted has been, at best very limited. Some new accessions to the confirmed roster are credited to the VLOA web page, members or from other sources.

With 2010 VLOA may possibly be approaching a crossroads. That being to actively and aggressively to search for the approximately 250 Outlaws not yet found and located to increase VLOA membership and potential for additional reunion participation. Without such and efforts, current VLOA membership and reunion participation may remain status quo with few exceptions. That situation continuing portends the potential for diminishing membership and reunion participation in later out years, and perhaps the fading of VLOA altogether as we now know it. We all recognize as time moves on, many factors impact on that situation: age, health, priorities, family, employment, etc.

With the above said, there are several options that VLOA may want to consider:


- 1) Remain status quo
- 2) Expand potential membership and reunion participation with aggressive search for others on the master roster (8/64 9/65) not already found and contacted

3) Expand VLOA membership to include others after 9/65

FUTURE VLOA REUNIONS FACE CHALLENGES

Forty four years ago, the name "Outlaws" was selected as the radio call-sign for the newly-formed helicopter company that had just deployed from Fort Benning, GA to the Mekong Delta in Vietnam. Almost immediately upon arrival in Vinh Long, some members of the original group were transferred to other in-country units to ensure a balanced unit rotation at the end of the one-year tour of duty. Other personnel were infused into the "Outlaws" to fill the vacancies. This same procedure was followed in the maintenance support unit (RoadRunners), the signal support unit, and other support units attached to the Outlaw unit. By the end of our first year in Vietnam, more than 500 soldier names were included on duty rosters of those collective Outlaw units, now known as the Vinh Long Outlaws (VLOA).

The name "Outlaws" endured for the remainder of the Vietnam conflict although the numerical designation of the original 62d Aviation Company ultimately morphed to become the 175th Aviation Company. However, the people who served in the 175th Outlaws have never formed a cohesive group such as the VLOA. They are essentially two separate "email" organizations who hold separate mini-reunions for a few hours in conjunction with the national conventions of the Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association (VHPA) or Vietnam Helicopter Crew Members Associations (VHCMA). If you don't belong to one of those groups, you have no opportunity to "belong" to a group such as our VLOA.

For ten years our original (first-year) Vinh Long Outlaws have enjoyed a delightfully unique bonding. There are a number of reasons why the VLOA continues to thrive: 1) We have a structured, formal, year-round "Association"; 2) We renew our friend-ships every two years at our VLOA reunions; 3) There is no distinction between former ranks of our members which brings our entire original unit together; 4) We publish a quarterly Newsletter to keep our members informed; 5) Numerous individual contacts have been reestablished between members which, in many cases, would not have happened if it were not for the VLOA organization itself. I know of no other company-size Vietnam helicopter unit that has established the total cohesiveness and camaraderie such as we have with our VLOA.

As Al Iller vividly points out in an article elsewhere in this Newsletter, our VLOA group, as we have known it for the past decade, is now at a crossroads. Read Al's article for a good analysis of what could be facing the VLOA.

It appears that attendance at the Hershey Roundup this year will be somewhat lower than in previous years. Conflicting dates with family activities is one reason. Costs of driving or flying are up from previous years. A few previous attendees may have lost interest.

But, an overriding, and compelling reason for not attending this year appears to be because of age-related health issues. All other reasons for not attending can be overcome with some planning and a little personal sacrifice, but we can't ignore the fact that we're all now 44 years older than our Vinh Long days, and many of us just can't make it to the reunion anymore. Nothing is more certain than the fact that, at some point in the future, we will be a "Last Man" organization. We were a small organization to begin with and, with our limited window of Outlaw Vietnam service (August '64 — September '65) as the criteria for primary membership, we will certainly face diminishing reunion attendance in future years.

I recently reviewed a couple articles I wrote for the first, <u>NEW</u>, Outlaw Newsletter back in 1999 where I emphasized that the 2000 Branson reunion would be the "one and only" reunion that the Vinh Long Outlaws would ever have. When we planned that reunion, there was no intention of doing it again. On the other hand, there was also no thought that the 120+ Outlaws and friends who came to that first reunion would almost <u>demand</u> that more reunions be held! So we did, and we have now been having VLOA reunions for nearly a decade. What a great bunch of people we have in this VLOA organization!


So, with all that as the background, here are a few challenges for all of you:

<u>First</u>, let me make one more appeal to those of you who might still be "on the fence" about coming to Hershey for R2K8. <u>If there's any way possible that you can come to the Hershey reunion</u>, **DO IT!** You won't regret it. VLOA REUNIONS

AN APPROACH FOR MEMBERSHIP CONSIDERATION

Past VLOA reunions have essentially been planned, organized and executed by individual volunteers willing to accept the responsibility. This was accomplished in full coordination and approval by the VLOA Steering Committee. Volunteers, in most cases were either at or near the selected reunion site locations. However, there have been situations where the volunteer planner was some distance from the reunion site and occasional travel was made to effect required on site coordination. In most cases, volunteers relied on professional tour/convention/reunion agent planners to assemble a package of accommodations, meals, events, transportation and various venues available based on detailed and specific VLOA reunion requirements. The VLOA volunteer reunion planner then recommended to the Steering Committee for their final approval the package which best met our reunion requirements. A large percentage of the required coordination and negotiation with these agents was done at 'arms length' by telephone, internet Email, FAX and when necessary mail. Although desirable to have VLOA planner(s) at or near the reunion site, it is not absolutely necessary. Working with these agents has proven highly satisfactory and efficient as evidenced by the successful VLOA reunions held to date. Additionally, use of agents significantly reduced the demand for personal time, effort and expense for the VLOA volunteers. Otherwise, an extraordinary amount of time would have been required to individually select, negotiate and coordinate separately with many different entities offering potential reunion accommodations, meals, transportation, venues and services.

Moreover, while previous reunion coordinators have willingly volunteered to take on the very time consuming task, it will become increasingly more difficult, in future years, for the Steering Committee to identify and convince more VLOA members to accept the responsibility for hosting and coordinating future reunions.

Successful reunions require an enormous amount of coordination, energy, commitment, organizational and communications skills. While the VLOA has shown itself to have people with these attributes, and we don't like to admit it, age has to be considered a factor in the consideration of those who have the skills necessary to put on a successful reunion. Professional event planners do this for a living, have the resources to devote full time to the task, and are not constrained by the aging factor.

There are many professional tour/convention/reunion agent planners/organizers nationally, regionally or locally oriented with offices throughout the U.S. Many, who are regional or local also offer nation wide these services through affiliated or cooperative agreements with others. Although many offer a full range of tour, convention, and reunion services some specialize in coordinating events only for certain groups (e.g. high school, college, government, social, religious, military, etc. etc.). The advantages of VLOA employing such an agent/planner for future VLOA reunions are as follows:

- 1) Eliminates total reliance and burden on VLOA volunteer(s) for reunion site selection, planning, coordination and execution.
- 2) Provides opportunity for initiation of planning for the next reunion by the Steering Committee immediately at the conclusion of the last.
 - 3) Provides for a wider selection of potential future reunion sites by VLOA membership.
 - 4) Insures professional quality reunion planning, coordination and organization by selected agent planner.
 - 5) Process requires full involvement of VLOA Steering Committee as originally envisioned.
- 6) In the event a situation of a withdrawal of the designated Steering Committee member(s) as primary reunion coordinator(s) would facilitate transfer of this responsibility to another Steering Committee member(s) with minimum interruption to the reunion planning process.

This approach is presented in this newsletter for the VLOA membership in preparation for a presentation during the biennial business meeting at Hershey Roundup R2K+8 for your consideration and discussion on VLOA employing an experienced professional agent planner for our future reunions. The presentation will include a general overview of the services normally offered by professional tour/convention/reunion agent planners.
