s the first commander of the 62d Aviation Company, (later A/502d), I want to send my warmest and most sincere welcome to every "Outlaw". Who would have thought, 35 years ago, how vivid some of the memories would still be of our times together in Vinh Long. Over the years we have all gone on with our lives in hundreds of different ways, but the experiences of those early Viet Nam days formed a bond between us that can only be understood by those who were together there.

Last year several of us located each other and got together in Branson, MO for a few days of friendship renewal and remembrances. While there, we decided to try to locate as many as possible of the people who were with the Outlaws during that first, formative year from August '64 when DEROS dates began separating us. Hours and hours of searching and digging are now paying off. We have made contact with over 100 of that group, with more being added to the roster every week.

Because we had such a great time together in Branson, getting the entire company together again as a group was a constant theme of the Branson Bunch discussions. So, we set out to make it happen. First, we designated the Branson Bunch as a "Steering Committee" to guide the efforts and to rovide support to the many tasks that will be required. Ernie and Linda Isbell volunteered to

serve as Treasurer and to set up an organization which was named the "Vinh Long Outlaws Association"



Our intention is to just get together in 2000 to renew the bonds of friendship we had when we left Vinh Long 35 years earlier. As of now, we are planning to meet in Branson, MO the weekend of 14-18 September 2000. Mark your Bicentennial calendars!! More information will be coming as the time approaches.

## R&R Roster & Reunion 2000 Al Iller

he enclosed OUTLAW ROSTER contains information only on those with whom confirmed contact has been made. All information has been verified with the respective individual, typos excepted. A MASTER ROSTER is maintained which contains all the names of those individuals originally assigned to the 62<sup>nd</sup> Avn Co who deployed to RVN from Ft. Benning, GA 9/64 as well as other known members assigned after arrival in country "9/64 -9/65". The MASTER ROSTER includes additional information regarding members spouses' name, period assigned to the unit (To/From - Mo/Yr), section/platoon/position while assigned (8/64 thru 9/65) and call sign if known. Much of the information on former unit members has been obtained from a variety of sources to include: original deployment orders, Army Aviation Association of America (AAAA) "Spoof Roster", Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association (VHPA) "Directory", etc. Diligent search through the Internet for addresses and Email has led us to many of our contacts. Any information whatsoever on other former members during the stated period or corrections can be forwarded to either Tom Anderson, John Doyle, or Al Iller for inclusion on the MASTER ROSTER. We appreciate your help in the effort to locate other stray or lost Outlaws and Mavericks. Good sources for identifying former members who fit that period are award orders, crew orders, AC orders, etc. Should anyone desire information regarding specific individuals not found on the CONFIRMED ROSTER Tom, John or Al may be contacted and will provide you any available information from the MASTER ROSTER.

The millennium is fast approaching and with it our planned R2K OUTLAW ROUNDUP in September at Branson, Missouri. For those not familiar with Branson, it is located in the southwest portion of the state overlooking Table Rock Lake and Lake Taneycomo near the Arkansas border. It is a year round vacation spot noted for its scenic

Ozark Mountain beauty, variety of music shows and entertainment, Silver Dollar City, restaurants, factory direct shopping malls (3), sport fishing and outdoor activities. Springfield, MO, the home of the Big Bass Pro Shops, is just a short hour drive to the north. The Branson/Springfield Regional Airport is the entry pont for air travelers coming to the area. Anyone desiring more specific information on Branson and area attractions contact Al Iller for a visitor information packet.

It has been necessary to start early planning for our R2K OUTLAW ROUNDUP to remain well ahead of the "power curve". A program of specific events is under development which will include lodging, meals, entertainment and other activities. 
